### Watch Walk and Talk Colossians 4:2-6

# A study thru the gospels reveals that Jesus was a man of Prayer –

- A) Prayer was an important aspect of His life
- **B**) He prayed before Choosing his disciples / He spent time in prayer after long days of ministry 1) He prayed in the late evenings as well as in the early morning hrs
- C) In the mist of heavy trials **Prayer was a solace**
- 1) Jesus was a MAN OF PRAYER

#### He was also a man on a Mission !!!

- A) He knew why He was here What He was to be doing
- B) He made the most of every opportunity to fulfill that mission redeeming the time
- C) He wasn't distracted but He made use of every opportunity to reveal the Father's heart / way.

### He was also a man who Knew how to talk to People

- A) He knew what to say / when to say it / and the all important How it should be said
- B) Well as Paul closes out this section on Col. that deals w/ Practical Christian living { started Ch. 3
- C) He Focuses on these 3 things How to Pray / How to walk / and How to talk { Rd v 2-6

#### Paul starts with our PRAYER LIFE v.2:

- A)Prayer and worship are perhaps the highest uses of the gift of speech.
- W. Wiersbe says that *Prayer is like Air for our soul.*
- B) In the natural world we need four things to survive, we need food, water, air, and light.
- 1) Take any one of those away and **the natural** world falls apart.

- C) In the spiritual world it's the same way, we need food, water, light, and air.
- 1) The light of the Christian life is Jesus Christ, our water is the Living Water that comes from the Holy Spirit.
- D) Our food is the Word of God, and our air is prayer.
  - 1) Prayer is like air for our souls.

Now in this verse Paul gives us 4 insights into what makes for a Satisfying & Powerful prayer life.

- A) First, our praying must be faithful. "Continue earnestly in prayer"
- B) The Greek word here for, continue earnestly, is proskartereo, which is a compound word that is made up of Kartereo,
- 1) which means to **be steadfast, or constant, or to give priority to**.
- C) And the preposition, Pros, which adds intensity and force to the verb.
- 1) So it is describing a Steadfast devoted and persistent prayer life.
- D) So the idea is that prayer should not only be something that we are constantly doing,
- 1) But it should be something that are constantly doing with passion & intensity.

### Christians must remember that prayer is like the mortar that holds the bricks together,

- A) Without the mortar everything falls apart;
- B) And without daily private prayer, Christians face a spiritual anorexia. {
- C) ''If I had eight hours to chop down a tree, I'd spend six hours sharpening my ax.'' -- Abe Lincoln,

#### So first Continue earnestly

2<sup>nd</sup> Our praying must also be watchful.

- A) Vigilant is translated watchful & alert
- A) The phrase "Watch and pray!" is used often in the Bible.
- B) It had its beginning in Bible history when Neh. was rebuilding the walls and gates of Jerusalem: "Nevertheless we made our prayer

unto our God, and set a watch against them [the enemy] day and night" (Neh. 4:9).

C) Jesus used the phrase Watch & pray several times as did Paul - (Eph. 6:18).

### Now our watchfulness is going to be determined by the degree of awareness of the battle we are in

- A) Consider the difference between two military sentries.
- B) One is guarding the Armory here in OCSD. The other is guarding a platoon in IRAQ.
- C) Which one is probably going to be more attentive? Which one will be more watchful?

  1) The guy in Iraq- because he <u>really realizes</u> that he is in a Battle.
- D) Listen because we're in a spiritual battle, we need to stay on high alert at all times Watch & Pray.

# Prayer is the last thing that SATAN wants us to be doing –

- A) I was going thru a trial last week that really had me stressed out & irritable
- B) I talked to a Pastor friend of mine about it I talked to my wife I EVEN talked to myself
- 1) Which is always dangerous –
- C) And although I received good counsel in the situation My mind was still wrestling & confused
- 1) My heart was still discouraged UNTIL .... I talked to God
- D) He spoke so clearly to me about what I needed to do how I needed to handle this 1) I THOUGHT: Why did I wait to talk to You
- E) I have times where the best thing I can do is to get away from the normal routine and go talk to God
- 1) Spend the whole day battling & wrestling in Prayer -

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Our praying should also be thankful: Being vigilant or watchful in it with thanksgiving.

A) Thanksgiving is an important ingredient in successful praying.

#### B) Gratitude is a stimulus to prayer-

- 1) Sincere gratitude to God is one of the best ways to put fervor into our praying.
- C) Guys we have so much to be THANKFUL FOR!
- D) Personally, I don't think there's anything more abhorrent than grumpy believers.
- 1) Don't they realize how good God has been to them? They're going to heaven. They have the Word. The Spirit indwells them.
- E) I don't think there's a single excuse for a rational person to be grumpy.
- 1) Thanksgiving should be flowing from our lips constantly.

## Paul declared in 1 Thes 5:17 He prayed w/out ceasing –

- A) This doesn't mean you go around muttering prayers to yourself all day –
- B) They have places for people like that where the doors lock on the outside
- C) Rather it means to go through the day Practicing the Presences of God
- 1) Being aware of God's Presence with you offering prayers in each situation **thanks/ Help Finally, our praying ought to be** *purposeful*: A)Too often our prayers are vague and general.
- B) I think one of the reasons for our vagueness in prayer is because we are ignorant of God's specific will
- C) Which is why I think it is important to study the prayers of the  $Bible \{$  Give us insight into God's will

It has well been said that the purpose of prayer is not to get man's will done in heaven, but to get God's will done on earth.

- D) Prayer is not telling God what to do or what to give.
- 1) Prayer is asking God for that which He wants to do and give, according to His will (1 John 5:14–15).
- E) As we read the Word and fellowship with our Father, we discover His will and then boldly ask Him to do what He has planned.

Richard Trench archbishop of Dublin, (1807–1886), said it perfectly: "Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance; it is laying hold of His willingness."

Paul has a specific thing in mind as he asks them to pray for His ministry v.3-4 praying also for us, that God would open to us a door for the word, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in chains,4 that I may make it manifest, as I ought to speak.

- A) The proclamation of the Gospel is empowered by prayer.
- B) A visitor at **Spurgeon's Church in London** was asked by Pastor Spurgeon
- 1) "Would you like to see the powerhouse of this ministry?" BASEMENT 150 PP praying
- C) Is it any wonder that God blessed Spurgeon's preaching of the Word?
- 1) Sometimes people say to me "Well, the least I can do is to pray for you."
- D) The *most* you can do for CCV is to pray!
- 1) Pray for your pastors as we prepare the Word, study, and meditate.
- E) Pray that the Holy Spirit will give deeper insights into the truths of the Word. / Sensitive to HS leading
- 1) Pray that we would live out what we are preaching in our homes &
- F) Can I encourage you pray on your way to Church as a Family/ for me/ Children's ministry/ Worship

Now This intrigues me. Paul says, "Pray for us—not that we'll get out of here, but that the Word will go forth from here."

- A) I think if I were writing this, I would say, "Please pray for me that I'll get out of here. I'm tired of being in prison."
- B) Not so Paul. He says, "My desire is that God's Word will go forth from here,

  1) that those around me will really see that C
- 1) that those around me will really see that Christ lives in me." **Truly, this is the way to pray.**
- C) How I want to be more like Paul. I've got so much to learn in this arena—
- D) Like the Early Church they Prayed for boldness **not the persecution to stop**
- E) Your Job / marriage / not get me out of here
  1) See it as an opportunity to shine for Jesus with
  your life & with your words

So the first thing Paul does is give us insight in how we are to WATCH & PRAY

- A) Next he turns is focus to how we are to WALK AND TALK { Rd v 5-6
- 5 Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time.6 Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one.
- A) Now there are 4 things that we want to note concerning how we are to walk & talk
- B) # 1. Be wise. Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside,
- C) To be wise in the way we walk means that we're careful not to say or do anything that would undermine our witness
- D) In other words we need to remember that those who don't yet know Christ are watching us.

When Dr. Will Houghton became pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle in Atlanta, a man in that city hired a private detective to follow him around and report on his conduct. After a few weeks, the detective reported that Dr. Houghton's life matched his preaching. As a result, the man became a Christ follower.

- E) It is True you might be the only Bible some unbelievers will every read
- 1) we need to be careful about the way we act because people are making decisions about the validity of Christianity based upon how we're living.

#### #2. BE READY - redeeming the time

- A) To redeem the time is a Commercial term that means to "buy up."
- B) It's the picture of finding something on sale and buying all you can afford because the price is so good.
- 1) Likewise, we're to buy up every opportunity to speak for Christ when we see one. –
- C) Are you making the most of the opportunities you have every day?
- 1) Life is going so fast. We need to Make it count. How? Redeem it.

### According to those who study such things, the average American will spend six months of his life waiting at red lights.

- A) What if we decided that at every red light to pray for people in our fellowship Prayer list
- B) What if we decided to keep an open Bible on the seat next to us in order to read a verse or two during every red light? To Meditate on & Memorize the word
- C) I'm not even talking about getting up at three in the morning. I'm talking about just using the time they're at stoplights. Redeeming the time!
- D) And taking advantage of every opportunity to share Christ Show love / Be Kind
  Peter put it this way in 1 Peter 3:15: "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.
- E) SO #2 Be ready: Redeem the time #3. Be gracious. Let your speech always be with grace,

A)It's important that we communicate w/words of grace when we speak w/ those who don't know Christ.

- B) Grace" in their speech presupposes grace in their hearts, "for out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks" (Matthew 12:34).
- C) Unfortunately, many times believers go off on people who are living in sin.
- 1) Or, we let loose about a moral issue in our culture, forgetting that there may be someone listening who is caught in that particular sin.
- D) When we're filled with anger and rage people feel judgment, not hope.

## We need to be more like Jesus, who was the perfect embodiment of both truth and grace.

- A) Even when He dealt with sin, He spoke words of grace.
- B) In Luke 4:22, after listening to Jesus teach, the people "spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his lips."
- C) Our speech is supposed to "minister grace unto the hearers" (Eph. 4:29).
- 1) But it cannot do that unless we have grace in our hearts and in our words.

Prov. 10:20-21 The tongue of the righteous is choice silver; 21 The lips of the righteous feed many,

- D) That is how I want to be Gracious words
- # 4. Be appetizing. Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one.
- A)Salt enhances flavor and makes food appetizing.
- B) Salt also was a healing element it was applied to wounds in the ancient culture for healing
- C) Our speech is to have a flavor enhancing / healing affect upon our conversations
- D) Salt also makes people thirsty Our talk / our attitudes are meant to make people thirsty for JC
