Titus 2:6-10 Sound Doctrine = Sound Behavior Part 3

The last few weeks we have camped out in Titus 2 - Sound doctrine results in sound behavior

A)Sound = healthy that which brings life and healing to that which is broken

B)So healthy doctrine - results in healthy behavior that results in a healthy church

C)Started looking at Paul's admonition to the Older men -

1)Last week the older women

IN both groups Paul used the word Reverent in their behavior

A)Reverent is a word that means - consecrated holy and set apart -

B)We noted that it is a word that was used to describe the whole temple complex= - in that it was consecrated to God

C)The temple had a calling and purpose in the Kingdom of God

That is the point - the Older men and women in the church have a calling & a purpose in the body of Christ.

A)That calling and purpose is to be examples to those who are young

B)Pave the way for ministry - service and godly example to the young men and women

C)Tonight we come to v. 6 - Paul brings his attention to the younger men

V.6 Likewise: In the same way you are admonishing the older men and women to be concerned about their walks

A)So too the younger men: - 6 Likewise, exhort the young men to be sober-minded, 7 in all things

B)Interesting - to the older men and women - Paul said teach - but to the younger men - he said exhort - why the difference

C)EXHORT = to urge to plead - to summon

C)Exhort is Parakaleo - word spoken of the Holy Spirit - it means called alongside to help.

D)That is interesting to this passage: Because Paul is not just saying Titus tell the young men to be Sober minded

1)He is saying - come alongside them/ walk with them and show they what it looks like to be sober minded

E)And the fact that exhort is in the present imperative - that means it is a continuous action -

1)Or put it another way: it is a habitual lifestyle - it is a regular practice - walking together - through life

Again: Older guys - pick a younger guy to mentor and pour into.

A)Might be similar age but younger in the faith or ministry.

B)Paul in Oregon - I Mentored him - spent time with him - 2 yrs

C)Then I turned my attention to a couple of other guys -

1)he got hurt - bro you need to find younger guy to do the same thing with them

D) Key is we are to always be reproducing!

So older guys - walk with the younger guys, showing them how to be Sober minded

A)Sober minded = Sensible clear headed - not reckless

B)There is a book called over the edge: It is about how the most vulnerable group at the Grand Canyon is young men.

C)Because they think they are invincible - so they get reckless - die

D)So our job guys is to help the younger guys be sensible - clear headed

E)But to do so in a way that doesn't quench their zeal!

Young guys often have great Zeal! Excited - Impact the world - I love it!!!!

A)But they lack Knowledge and experience - that can be dangerous

It is dangerous to have zeal without knowledge, and the one who acts hastily makes poor choices. Proverbs 19:2 NET

B)Balance: Don't quench their zeal - but help them to avoid pit falls

C)Years ago - I had a youth pastor who came to me and in his zeal said if I would hire six interns to help him

1)He would get studies going in all 6 of the High School campuses in our area.

D)It was a zealous and ambitious declaration -

1)I love seeing our youth guys being on High School campuses -

E)I know how it can be affective in reaching lost kids.

In fact when I was the High School Pastor here - I actually - - had studies going on 6 campuses by myself I might add ☺

A)Vista, Rancho, San Marcos, Oceanside, Carlsbad, El Camino - One study each day of the week and Oceanside and Carlsbad - same day

B)Their lunch times were opposite - so I could do Oceanside and jet to Carlsbad afterwards

C)It was pretty affective in reaching the lost. -

D)We had students coming to those studies - who got saved - and started coming to YG - 1)From all those schools

E))Did that for a whole year - that schedule almost killed me -

1)I wasn't smart enough to teach the same study at each school - 6 different -

2)Plus the 2 I was doing here at church

The Following year: Sharp Shooter vs Shotgun blast

A)So I felt led to focus on the one school that was really doing well - Rancho

B))Study and also started an FCA group - it God really poured out his spirit it ended up being the largest in San Diego -

C)That year our youth group grew by at 60 kids who's parents either were not saved or didn't attend this church.

So because of that experience: I suggested to my vouth Pastor -

A)Why don't you get one study going at one school - really strong

B)Once it gets going - we can bring on an intern part time to assist you -

1)then you can go get one going at another school

C)He liked that idea but ended up not starting any school studies - or tried and nothing panned out

D) The last thing I wanted to see was six young guys sitting around floundering with nothing to do.

1)First got here we were over staffed - too many guys with nothing to do

He had great zeal - that just needed to be pointed in the right direction.

A)There have been other times here where the approach that Steve and I might take to a young guy with a BIG IDEA

B) Even though in our minds we are thinking - that isn't going to work -

1)but we don't want to quench his zeal - so we say - Go for it

C)And we watch - check in a week or two later - Now if he asks our advice we will give -

1)but if he doesn't we watch - cheer on

SO we Watch Hoping that we are going to be surprised

A)But if it doesn't work out and fails - we see it as an opportunity to have a teaching moment to see how to do it better next time.

B)Mentoring process - help them become sober minded - clear headed

1)Guys with Zeal that is coupled with Knowledge

So the old men are to walk with the younger menteaching them how to be sober minded.

A)It is going to take building relationships -

B)walking with them - and a willingness of the young men to WANT TO BE MENTORED.

After addressing the young men- Pastor Titus himself - who was also a younger man -

A)One of Paul's sons in the faith

B)What he says here is great stuff for anyone here who aspires to be in full time ministry

C)Anyone who desires to be in the role of an elder - these are things that God wants to be a part of your life

⁷ in all things showing yourself *to be* a pattern of good works; in doctrine *showing* integrity, reverence, incorruptibility, ⁸ sound speech that cannot be condemned, that one who is an opponent may be ashamed, having nothing evil to say of you.

A Pattern of good works

A)The word pattern used here - specifically speaks of an impression - or a mold -

B)a molded copy of the original

C)The idea is this is visible behavior - the habits of his life were to be visible and tangible

D)Paul told Timothy - don't let anyone look down on your youth - but you be a pattern to those who believe.

E)Even though you are young Timothy - you set the example -

In doctrine: In your teaching - *showing* integrity, reverence, incorruptibility,

¹⁵ Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. 2 Timothy 2:15

NLT - Let everything you do reflect the integrity and seriousness of your teaching.

In other words - Practice what you preach:
A)Growing up at CCCM in the Jr. High and Sr.
High -

B)I had some youth leaders that sometimes crossed the line in this -

1)Attempt to be relatable - sometimes crossed the line into irreverence

C)Toothpaste skit - Richards challenge - my reaction

1)All things are lawful but not all things are expedient - fruitful or edifying

D)If you would have asked me I would have said no!

Sound in speech: - Sound = words that build up and heal rather than tear down and destroy.

A)There was a time in my early 20's when I was at CCCM - me and a group of my friends were reading the puritans -

B)Really getting into the holiness movement - Pastor Chuck was so into grace

C)There was a period of about 3-4 months when we got together and we would criticize Pastor chuck

1)If we were the Pastors this is what we would domake CCCM better place and more holy

D)None of us had ever led anything significant before - - Home groups and school studies

E)It was arrogant - it was sinful - I am ashamed of that behavior

Over the years I have been the recipient of that same type of talk from young men here behind my back –

A)Too be honest it is grieving for sure.

B)But I am able to give them grace because I stupidly did the same thing in my own pride and arrogance

C)Guys it is so much better to be men that have the reputation for building up rather than tearing down.

D)Men who sharpen others and help them see Jesus!

Note the reason for his exhortation: that one who is an opponent may be ashamed, having nothing evil to say of you.

A)Your conduct would be so good - so Christ-like - so refreshing that your adversaries would only have good things to say.

B)They would say: I don't believe what he believes - but I like him - he is an asset to this community - 1)he is an asset to this company.

Finally Paul is going to end this section on how Sound doctrine results in sound behavior by talking to the Slaves or Employee's

⁹ Exhort bondservants to be obedient to their own masters, to be well pleasing in all *things*, not answering back, ¹⁰ not pilfering, but showing all good fidelity, that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things.

Five things that are to mark the conduct of the Slave or the employees

A)#1 Obedient - subject or submitted to - good at following instructions - team players

B)Used of soldiers with their commanding officer - 1)To Place yourself under the leadership of someone to follow.

C)Because slaves were expected to be obedient in that culture - where slaves were the work force - 1)The idea here is more of a willing obedience - not forced or being obedient with a the right attitude.

²³ And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ, Colossians 3:23-24

I think Christian workers should be the best workers why? - Working for Jesus

A) Working at the grocery store - When can you work?

B)Higher me and I will be the best worker here? 1)Ok - hot shot Quickly promoted -

C)Not the most talented - or gifted - but I was the hardest working - doing it for Jesus

#2 Be well pleasing in all things: - this refers to an attitude of cheerful service

A)Pleasing, agreeable

B)You don't want your boss to be thinking - I wish I could fire this guy

#3 Not answering back - not argumentative - being respectful

A)The idea here is literally connected to the behavior of a child that talks back to their parents

B)Don't be like little kids - Be an adult -

Also, don't get caught up in bad mouthing the boss

A)In every work environment I have ever been a part of - there are always those who want to bad mouth the leadership or bosses

B)Paul is instructing these Christian brothers and sisters - you don't get caught up in that

C)You be different from that

#4 Not pilfering - not stealing -

A)Now most people would say - I don't do that - I would never do that

B)Ever take company products without asking - stealing

C)Ever leave early or come in late - without asking because you are on Salary you can get away with it - that is stealing.

#5 But showing all good fidelity - being trust worthy

A)When I read this - I couldn't help but think of Joseph - talk about a guy who was trust worthy

B)With Potiphar - over everything - trusted him even with his own wife

C)Be that kind of worker - the boss knows - I can trust him - give him responsibility

Purpose:

That they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things.

Sound doctrine when applied = sound behavior that results in a sound witness!
